- Give lots of verbal praise and claps for prosocial behaviour
- Award the Alder Grove Excellence Award / Vision Champion Award
- Think and give appropriate consequences
- Discuss with SLT or SENDCo additional rewards before using them

### English –



English is taught through Phonics/Guided Reading, Writing, Handwriting and Spelling lessons.

Guided Reading is to develop a love of reading and to develop fluency, retrieval and comprehension skills.

Accelerated Reader forms part of a child's Home Learning. Children take home reading books and complete online quizzes.

Writing is taught daily and is linked to the National Curriculum Objectives. The pupils are exposed to a range of genres and are given the opportunity to write independently regularly. All lessons are adapted to meet the needs of the individual child.

Handwriting is taught daily, beginning with learning mnemonics, lead in and out strokes and then joining letters to form words. As the children progress, they will focus on handwriting within sentences and dictations.

Spelling is taught through Phonics (phonics groups) and through daily spelling sessions (whole class). The children are taught spelling rules and statutory spellings.



### English – Reading Records

To support your children with reading it is important that you listen to your child read at least 5 times a week.

This year we will be moving away from paper reading records. We will instead be using digital reading records called Boom Reader.

This means you can record your child's reading activity through an appon your phone.

More information will be sent out in the coming weeks.



### Maths -



At the heart of maths in Alder Grove is the belief that all children can achieve. We use a mastery approach to maths based on the Power Maths Scheme which is built on an exciting growth mindset and problem-solving approach.

We encourage our learners to develop a deep understanding of maths concepts through the use of key vocabulary, carefully selected images and representations and ensure that pupils can apply what they know in different ways based on their year group's objectives.

Maths lessons are carefully structured so that it is taught for one hour each day linked to the National Curriculum objectives. In lessons, pupils are given opportunities to explore concepts, reason their ideas and are given broad and challenging problems to embed their understanding and knowledge.

In addition to the hour maths lesson is a 10-15 minute fluency lesson. In Reception and KS1, we use the Mastering Number programme which aims to strengthen the understanding of number, and fluency with number facts..

### Maths -



To support our learning in KS1 and KS2, we also have access to Doodle Maths. Doodle Maths is an interactive and adaptive learning program (based on the National Curriculum) for strengthening old maths skills and learning new ones.

We aim for our pupils to access Doodle Maths at least once a day to complete a 'daily doodle'. This can be completed at home as well as at school.





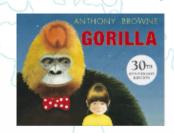
### Wider Curriculum

Each half term, a half termly overview will be sent home. The overview will share what Year 2 will be learning in the coming weeks.



#### English

We will begin the year by focusing on the popular story, 'The Gorilla' by Anthony Browne. The children will focus on the key characters in the story and use adjectives to describe them. We will still continue to focus on basic punctuation and applying their phonic knowledge for spelling. After this, we will move onto non-fiction writing based on gorillas. The children will use fact-files and video sources to gain information on gorillas. They will use this information to create their very own fact-file.



#### Handwriting - Cursive

We will be revising how to form our precursive letters correctly. We will then learn where to join our letters and practise writing words and sentences using a cursive, joined style,

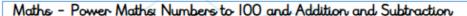

### History: Titanic - How were people treated differently on the Titanic?

We will be considering this key question as we learn about the Titanic. We will be studying the events that led up to the sinking of the ship and how the experience of being on the Titanic was different for various groups of people.





- To count in steps of 2, 3, and 5 from 0, and in 10s from any number, forward and backwards.
- To recognise the place value of each digit in a two-digit number (10s, Is).
- To identify, represent and estimate numbers using different representations, including the number line.
- . To compare and order numbers from 0 up to 100; using <, > and = signs.
- To read and write numbers to at least 100 in numerals and in words.
- To use place value and number facts to solve problems.

### Wider Curriculum

#### Computing: We are Astronauts

- To plan a sequence of instructions.
- To create, test and debug programs.
- To use repetition in my programs.
- To design costumes for sprites.

- To learn a traditional song from Ghana
- To create rhythms based on 'call and response'.

#### Arts Map it Out

The children are going to look at different types of maps and will use these as a stimulus for drawing. They will explore relief maps and create their own. They will then move onto looking at abstract maps and create their own map, inspired from the examples that they have studied. We will then develop ideas and apply craft skills to create a map from print.

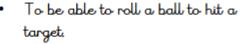
### Science - Living things and their habitats



We will be identifying and naming a variety of animals and plants in their habitats and exploring these key questions.

- How do we know if something is living?
- How are living things suited to their habitat?
- How do animals obtain their food from plants and other animals?







- To develop co-ordination and be able to stop a rolling ball.
- To develop technique and control when dribbling a ball with my feet.
- To develop control and technique when kicking a ball.
- To develop co-ordination and technique when throwing and catching:
- To develop control and co-ordination when dribbling a ball with my hands.

#### PE: Fundamentals

- To explore how the body moves when running at different speeds.
- To develop changing direction and dodging.
- To develop balance, stability and landing safely.
- To explore and develop jumping, hopping and skipping actions.
- To develop co-ordination and combining jumps.
- To develop combination jumping and skipping in an individual rope.
