

- 11:30am Lunchtime
- 12:30pm Nursery gate opens to welcome the afternoon children
- 2.30pm Home Time for some 30 hour children children dismissed from nursery doors
- **3.30pm** Home Time children dismissed from nursery doors



30 Hour Option

Full Use of the 30-Hour Entitlement (Including Lunch Hour):

• Children may attend from the beginning of the school day (8.30am until 2:30 pm), with no additional charges for childcare during this period. Please note that while the lunch hour is included within the 30-hour entitlement, parents/carers will be required to pay for a school-provided hot lunch if selected. Alternatively, packed lunches may be sent from home at no additional cost.

Option to Purchase an Additional Hour:

- Parents/carers may choose to extend their child's day to align with the dismissal time of pupils attending the 15-hour provision and the wider school. This additional hour is available for purchase and is arranged on a term-by-term basis. Once chosen, this arrangement must remain in place for the entire term and cannot be altered mid-term.
- Parents/carers wishing to amend their child's attendance pattern for the following term must notify the school via email before the start of the new term. If no communication is received, it will be assumed that the current arrangement will continue. Charges will apply for any additional hours requested, regardless of changes made to the funded hours. The cost of the additional hour is £6 each day.

If you have not already done so, please inform the office what your Autumn Term choice is – information can be found in welcome letter emailed out.



School Lunches

If your child is attending 30 hours a week they can either bring a packed lunch or you can pre-order them hot school dinners.

Milk/Snack

Milk is free for all nursery children. If they prefer they can have water at snack time or if they have allergies you may bring in different milk. We provide the children with fruit and crackers/breadsticks for snack times in nursery.

Allergies

We have many children in school with allergies so we ask for no nuts or sesame products in packed lunches.

Payments

We have an online payment system called Arbor, to allow parents to make all transactions through one system.



School Uniform - this is compulsory for all children

- Please label all uniform and belongings that your child brings into school.
- Wearing jewellery is not permitted, unless it is for religious or medical reasons.
- Plain black trainers –no large coloured logos
- Plain black jogging bottoms/leggings/shorts/cycling shorts (generic and no logos)
- School polo shirt (branded)
- School jumper/cardigan (branded)
- Black socks (generic)
- Long hair must be tied back with plain black/neutral hair bands or clips

Branded uniform can be ordered from our suppliers **Smart Impressions**.



What should my child bring to nursery?

Spare clothes - All children will require a bag with at least one full change of clothes in. We do lots of messy/water play and children often need to get changed. If your child requires changing this bag will be sent home otherwise we ask for in to remain in nursery.

Water bottle—please make sure it is a bottle that your child can open themselves.

Welly boots – all children require a pair of named welly boots to be left in nursery.

Coat/jacket – we explore outside in all weather!

Book Bag – all children require an Alder Grove branded book bag for library days.



Absence and lateness

- If your child is unwell and cannot attend school, please phone the school by 9.15am on the first and any subsequent days of their illness and give the reason for your child's absence.
- If your child has vomiting or diarrhoea you must keep your child at home for 48 hours after the last bout.
- Please ensure that your child arrives punctually and prepared for school. In the event of you arriving after 8:40 a member of the office team will take them safely to their classroom.
- Holidays should not be taken during term time and will be marked as an unauthorised absence.

Medication

- If your child requires regular medication, a care plan will be created with the school, parents and any medical professionals required.
- For prescription medication, a medical form from the office or website will need to be completed and taken to the office before any medication is administered. The school will not administer non-prescribed medication such as Calpol.
- The school will conduct regular checks, but it the responsibility of the parent/carer to ensure medication kept in school is in date.
